



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
The "Active Citizenship in the New Homeland" project is an innovative project in terms of bringing a new perspective and interpretation to the integration of asylum seekers and refugees in the country they live in, in the dimension of "Active Citizenship". Active Citizenship is the ability of individuals to determine the problems of the city, country, and the world they live in, to struggle with them and to increase their quality of life, and to use their right to participate. The importance of active citizenship stems from the fact that individuals have the power and potential to create a better society by making a direct and positive contribution to the society they live in. With the project, it is aimed to develop the "Active Citizenship for Asylum Seekers and Refugees" e-learning module. Each institution, which is a project partner, attended the opening meeting hosted by Marmara University with two representatives. Partner institutions made their presentations at the meeting. Project management and implementation process was explained to the partners by project coordinator Assoc. Dr. Sezgi Durgun. Information on project management, communication tools, reporting process, financial management, responsibilities of partners was given. Then, the activities to be carried out until the second transnational meeting were underlined. The most important of these activities were desk research that included the analysis of current studies and current policies on asylum seekers and refugees in the project partner countries, as well as the realization of experience sharing workshops with the participation of adult educators and asylum seekers and refugees in each partner's own institution. All Partners completed their literature research on the specified date and uploaded them to the project platform.























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EXPERIENCE SHARING WORKSHOPS (ESW)







Within the scope of Experience Sharing Workshops, focus group meetings were held with the participation of academics, administrators, adult educators, NGO representatives, asylum seekers and refugees. The total number of participants in these focus group discussions conducted by each partner was 115. In all focus group interviews, pre-developed semi-structured interview forms were used to enable the participants to reveal their experiences. Conversations were deciphered. Then, descriptive and content analyzes of these qualitative data were made. Thus, data were collected from the field so that the content of the e-module to be prepared is oriented to current needs and expectations.






















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2.MEETING IN PAU








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Online meeting
