#### 9TH-15TH OCTOBER


The LTT activity "Active Citizenship in the New Homeland Project" was held on 9-15 October, 2023 in Braga, Portugal and hosted by FAJUB, one of the project partners. The aim of the Act New Home Project, funded by the European Union Erasmus+ Programme and the Turkish National Agency, is to develop an e-learning platform for adult asylum seekers and refugees to raise awareness of active citizenship.





The LTT Event prepared by the host organization FAJUP was implemented with the aim of enhancing the knowledge, attitudes and skills of educators working with adult asylum seekers and refugees in

There were 32 participants from Marmara University, Başkent Public Education Centre and Kadıköy Public Education Centre from Turkiye, FAJUB from Portugal, Scout Society from Romania, Pistes Solidaires from France, Four Elements from Greece,

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On the first day of the LTT Program, an initial pre-test was conducted to assess the participants' knowledge on the subject. Following a general evaluation of the Active Citizenship e-learning platform various technical details were shared with the participants.



In the last part of the first day of the program, representatives from "Adolescere," a civil society organization working with refugees and migrants in Portugal, gave presentation to all participants, sharing information and experiences related to their activities.





















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On the second day of the program, theoretical presentations of Module 1 Basic Concepts prepared by Marmara University and Module 2 Basic Rights prepared by the Scout Society were made.



Subsequently, the exercises designed to be used in the education of adult refugees and asylum seekers were introduced within the scope of these modules and the selected exercises were applied in a practical classroom environment with the active participation of all participants.























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On the third day, Module 3 - Lifelong Learning prepared by Başkent Public Education Center and Kadıköy Public Education Center and Module 5 - Participatory Civil Life prepared by Pistes Solidaires were presented. Immediately after the theoretical presentations, exercises related to the respective modules were actively carried out with the participation of the LTT participants.























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On the fourth day, the theoretical presentation of Module 4 - Working Life, prepared in collaboration with Four Elements and Cuiablue, was made and exercise applications were carried out. Participants feedback on the modules was collected on the same day.























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At the end of the program, an "Intercultural Afternoon" event was organized to promote cross-cultural interaction and sharing.

































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On the final day of the LTT activity, a post-test was conducted to assess the knowledge and skills of the LTT participants across all modules, and the LTT activity was evaluated. To promote the sharing of best practices, various civil society organizations in Braga were visited to gather information about their activities.

Within the scope of the LTT activity, all modules comprising the "Active Citizenship E-Learning Platform" were evaluated in terms of content and structure. It was decided to adopt positive aspects to other modules and technical problems and solutions were identified and addressed. Necessary corrections were identified based on the feedback.

Additionally, standardization of the sub-modules in terms of content and structure was decided. Then the overall structure of the e-learning module was determined. In this context, the LTT activity has been considered as an efficient process that enhances the quality of the Active Citizenship E -Learning Module.







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### 4ST INTERNATIONAL MEETING/ ROMANYA-TARGU JIU 7 TH-8 TH NOVEMBER

The fourth International Meeting of the ACT NEW HOME (Active Citizenship in The New Homeland) was held on November 7-8, 2023 in Targu Jiu, Romania, hosted by Scout Society, one of the Project partners. All partner institutions were represented at the meeting.






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### 4ST INTERNATIONAL MEETING/ ROMANYA-TARGU JIU 7 TH-8 TH NOVEMBER
